

Afterschool Programs are a Necessity




A new national poll of registered voters finds that public support for afterschool programs is at an all-time high. Whether Democratic, Independent, or Republican; rural, urban, or suburban; younger or older; voters agree that programs are an absolute necessity. Why? Programs help parents work, strengthen the economy, and keep kids safe, connected, and engaged in learning. More than ever before, voters want their newly elected leaders to increase funding for afterschool programs.¹

Nearly **9 IN 10 VOTERS** agree that afterschool programs are an absolute necessity for communities, an all-time high for support.



AGREEMENT SPANS ALL DEMOGRAPHIC GROUPS

An overwhelming majority of voters in every demographic group agree that afterschool programs are an absolute necessity. Support grew among most groups, with rural, older, younger, and Independent voters increasing support by more than 10 percentage points since 2022.



^{1.} The online survey was designed and administered by Lake Research Partners and New Bridge Strategy. The survey was conducted between December 4-11, 2024, reaching 1,400 registered voters, including oversamples of Black, Latino, Asian American and Pacific Islander, and Indigenous registered voters. The margin of error is +/- 3.1%.

Prevent risky behaviors and exposure to negative influences in-person and online




Help children develop communication and social skills, replacing screen time with in-person interaction




Having access to quality, affordable afterschool and summer programs is important to help parents work and to strengthen the economy


