Frequently Asked Questions

General Schedule

The meeting begins at the Cordell Hull office building (425 5th Ave. N), where all legislative offices and committee hearing rooms are located. The group will convene from 8 am – 10 am on the 8th floor of the Cordell Hull office building, Rooms A & D.

You will need to pass through security/metal detectors upon entering Cordell Hull. Then you can take the elevators to the 8th floor.

Parking

Paid public parking is available in multiple garage and surface lots. Cordell Hull Legislative Office Building is located directly across Rep. John Lewis Way (5th Avenue) from the main bus station, which has a paid parking garage through Metropolis (MTA Garage, 400 Charlotte Ave).

***Street parking on Rep. John Lewis Way (5th Ave.) in front of the Cordell Hull office building or any of the streets surrounding the Capitol complex is not permitted by Tennessee Highway Patrol.*

Legislative Visits

Please call the Thursday or Friday the week prior to your visit to book your own visits with your legislators. At this time they will know their schedules for the week and be able to get you on the calendar since constituents always get priority. Calling is best, as they receive hundreds of emails per day/hour. ***The legislative schedule can be unpredictable so meetings are subject to being rescheduled, delayed or changed at the last minute.* Look up your legislator at the Find My Legislator link or by looking at the Members list at www.Capitol.TN.Gov.

Committee Hearings

You may enter or leave a committee hearing at any point during the meeting. There is seating available to the public in each room. No loud talking, hats, signs, filming or live-streaming is permitted and no food or beverage is allowed other than water.

Attire

Attire is business dress, jackets and ties for men with comparable dress for women. However, the day involves a lot of standing and walking, so be prepared with comfortable shoes.

Please bring local data on the work of your United Way in the community, and any local swag you can leave behind with the assistants and legislators.
